

TREMFYA withMe Trial Offer

Offer Description

With the TREMFYA withMe Trial Offer, eligible patients can try their first subcutaneous dose of TREMFYA at no cost to see if it's right for them. At the conclusion of the trial, you and your patient decide whether to continue treatment. Terms expire at the end of each calendar year and may change.

Offer Requirements

To be eligible, the patient must have:

- a TREMFYA prescription for an FDA-approved, on-label use
- commercial insurance, including plans from the Health Insurance Marketplace

Other requirements

- Prescriber must send an Electronic Prescription (eRx) to Access Therapy Center – J&J Company (NCPDP: 6012974) via the Electronic Health Record (EHR) (include diagnosis code and insurance information in the Notes section) OR submit a completed Patient Enrollment Form (PEF) to TREMFYA withMe
- Patients may not seek payment for the value received from this Offer from any health plan, patient assistance foundation, flexible spending account, or healthcare savings account
- One (1) use is allowed per lifetime
- Terms expire at the end of each calendar year. The Offer may change or end without notice, including in specific states
- By using the TREMFYA withMe Trial Offer, you confirm that your patient has read, understood, and agrees to the Offer requirements
